

Block Party rockin' beats this Saturday!

The new streetscapes on Guyton Street and St Hill Street are set to be celebrated with a free community party this Saturday, 18 May 2024, featuring an epic line up of local bands and musicians, delicious kai and fun and games for young and old!

Ninety percent-funded by NZ Transport Agency Waka Kotahi, the Streets for People Block Party marks the completion of the Streets for People project on Guyton Street and lower St Hill Street and the wider work to improve bus shelter facilities across Whanganui through the Transport Choices programme.

The party will feature two distinct event spaces – lower St Hill Street (where a public transport hub has been created) and Guyton Street (between St Hill Street and Victoria Avenue) where a new community park and streetscape have been developed.

The first section of the event will be the **Public Transport** Hub Celebration on St Hill Street (next to the Trafalgar Square carpark), running from 10.00am-1.00pm. This event will feature live music, free face painting for kids, a sausage sizzle raising money for Women's Network Whanganui, and special Bee Card giveaways.

On-demand shuttle will run Recycling crates rolling out! during lift's maintenance

The Durie Hill Elevator will close for scheduled annual maintenance next Monday, 20 May, and resume usual service on Saturday, 1 June 2024. As a temporary replacement during the closure, elevator operator Whanganui Connection will have an on-demand shuttle available. The shuttle will run between the elevator's Anzac Parade entrance and Blyth Street entrance on Durie Hill from 8.00am-6.00pm weekdays, and 10.00am-5.00pm weekends, with some short driver breaks. This service will be on-demand – signs at each elevator entry point will have a phone number to text or call to request the shuttle. The shuttle will accept current elevator concession tickets, along with cash and Eftpos. Bikes are welcome on the shuttle.





Just before 1.00pm a group of local cycle enthusiasts – including Whanganui Green Bikes - will pedal their way up from the St Hill Street site to Guyton Street (via the town centre) marking the transition to next event space: the Guyton Street Block Party.

The Block Party runs from 1.00pm-8.00pm, and will see the section of Guyton Street between St Hill Street and Victoria Avenue closed to traffic, allowing for the street to be transformed into a space for the community to party and play!
