

## Recycling Olympics thinking caps on!

While the sporting Olympics take place in Paris, Whanganui District Council is running a local version of the competition – the Recycling Olympics – and there are some great prizes up for grabs!

Open until midnight next Wednesday, 14 August, the Recycling Olympics is all about coming up with cool ideas for games or sports that make use of waste materials – especially stuff that can't go in your kerbside recycling crates (like lids and bottle caps).

#### **How it works**

- 1. Come up with your game using as many recycled materials as possible.
- 2. Submit a short video showing us how the game works.
- 3. Prizes will be awarded based on how fun the game looks to play, and how cleverly you make use of recycled materials.

Prizes up for grabs include a bicycle from Whanganui Green Bikes, two Splash Centre prize packs (including a tote bag, a swim cap and family swim and slide passes), and a special three-tier recycling trolley.

After a successful fundraising campaign, Whanganui Regional Heritage Trust and Whanganui's two Rotary clubs are collaborating to restore and reinstate a historic stretch of fence on Durie Hill (pictured above).

The picket fence was initially built in the 1890s to border the grounds of Thomas and Jeannie Duncan's Puke Tiro homestead. The Duncans had a strong interest in pioneering techniques for the treatment of neuromuscular patients, particularly those with polio, and converted their homestead to a charitable and privately-funded children's hospital called the Duncan Hospital for Poliomyelitis. The couple set aside their Otiwhiti Station property in Hunterville as a charitable trust to fund the hospital.

Bruce Dickson of the Whanganui Heritage Regional Trust said the project objectives were to "restore the fence and acknowledge the enormous generosity that the Duncan family has bestowed on Whanganui over many decades, seen not just in the Duncan Polio Hospital but in the many other major donations made to the city".

"The fence is the last remaining vestige of the Duncan Hospital in Whanganui and a reminder of the layers of social and historical significance at the site."
